



A MIGRANT bird lives in Klamath and Lake Counties during the spring and summer and travels to a tropical country to live in the fall and winter.




A RESIDENT bird lives in Klamath and Lake Counties all year long.

































































The White-headed Woodpecker eats wood-boring bugs from old growth ponderosa pine trees.






















The Song Sparrow's beautiful melody consists of three or four short, clear notes followed by a buzzy "towwee" and a trill.
