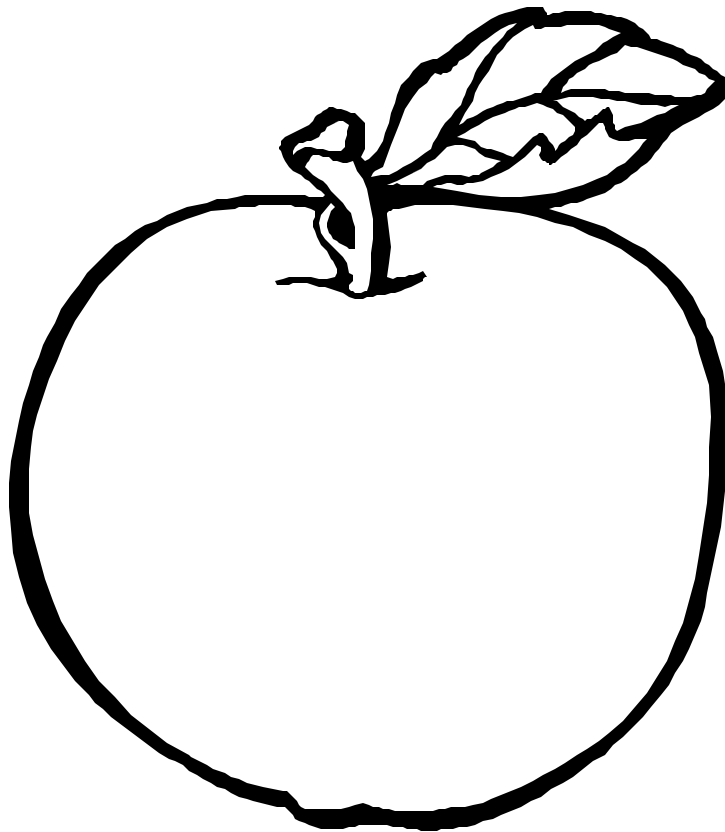

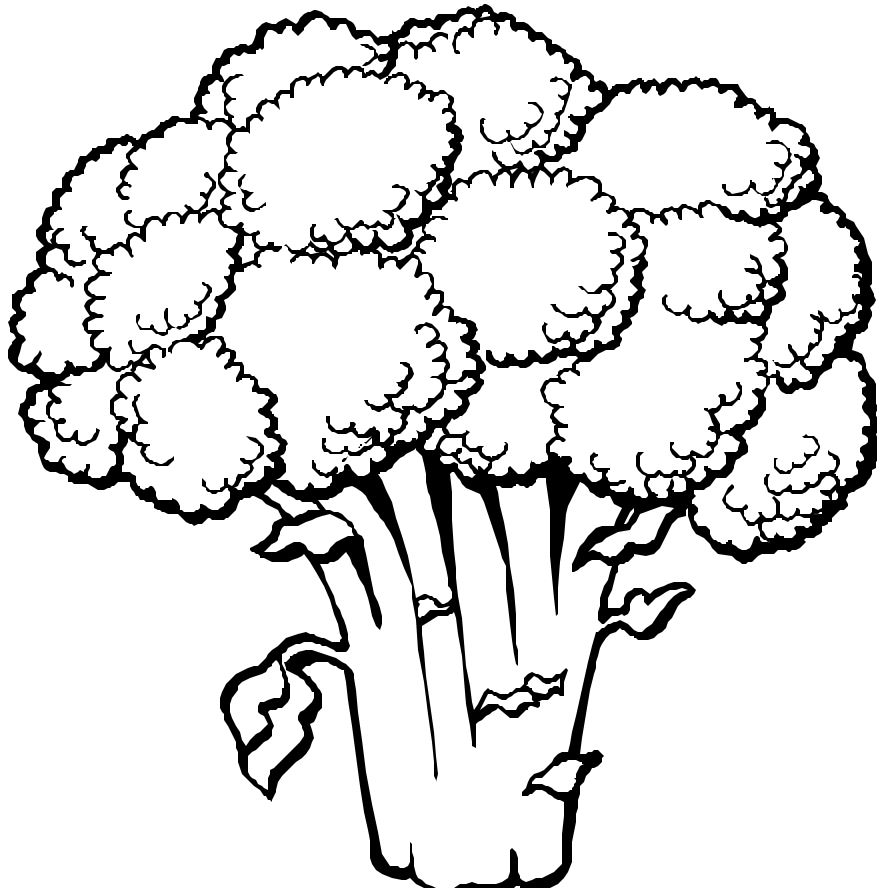


apple

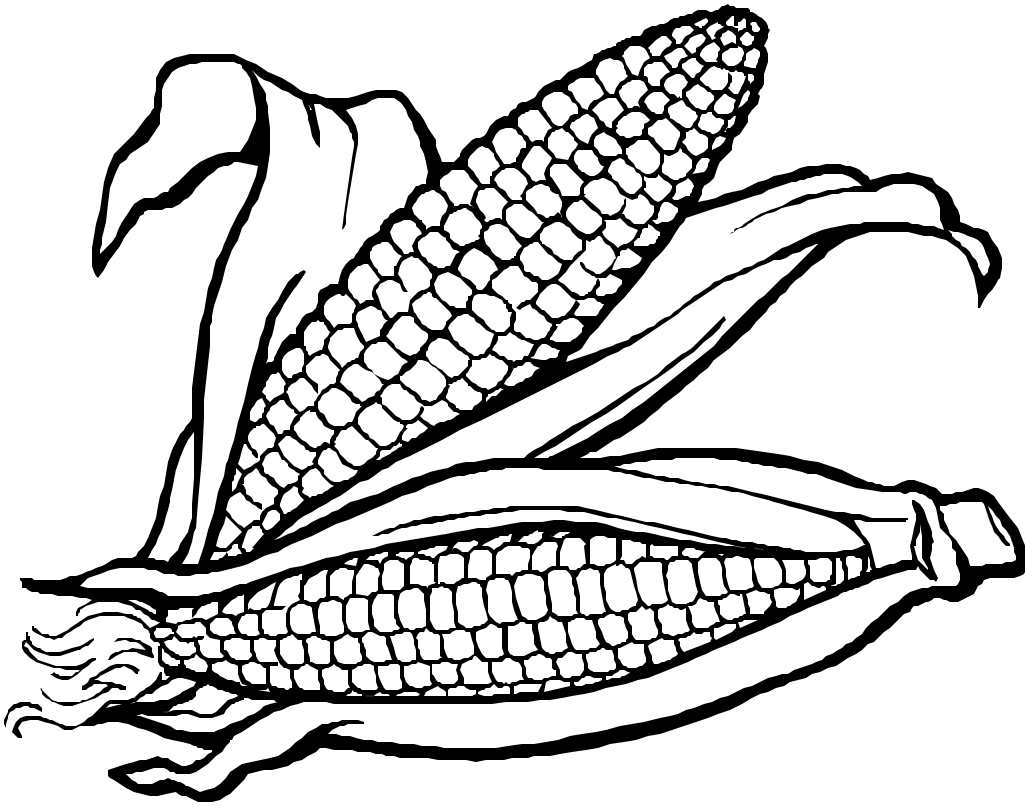


broccoli

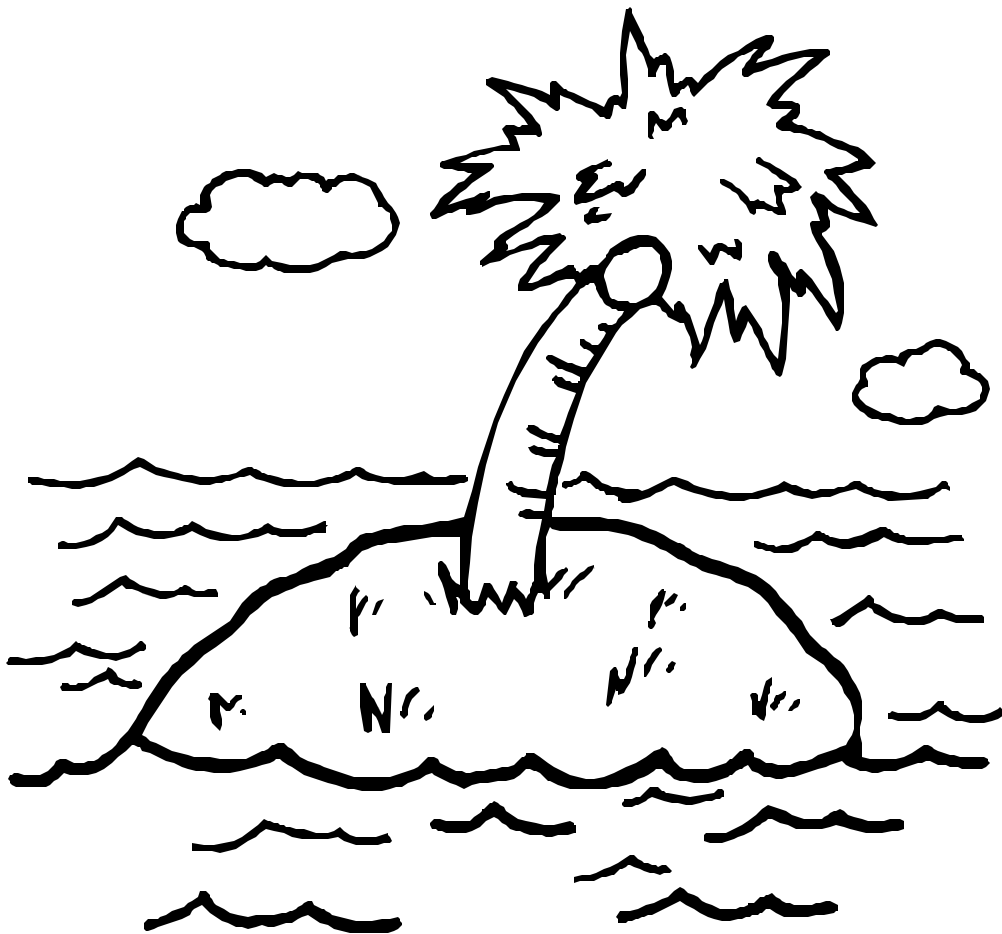


corn

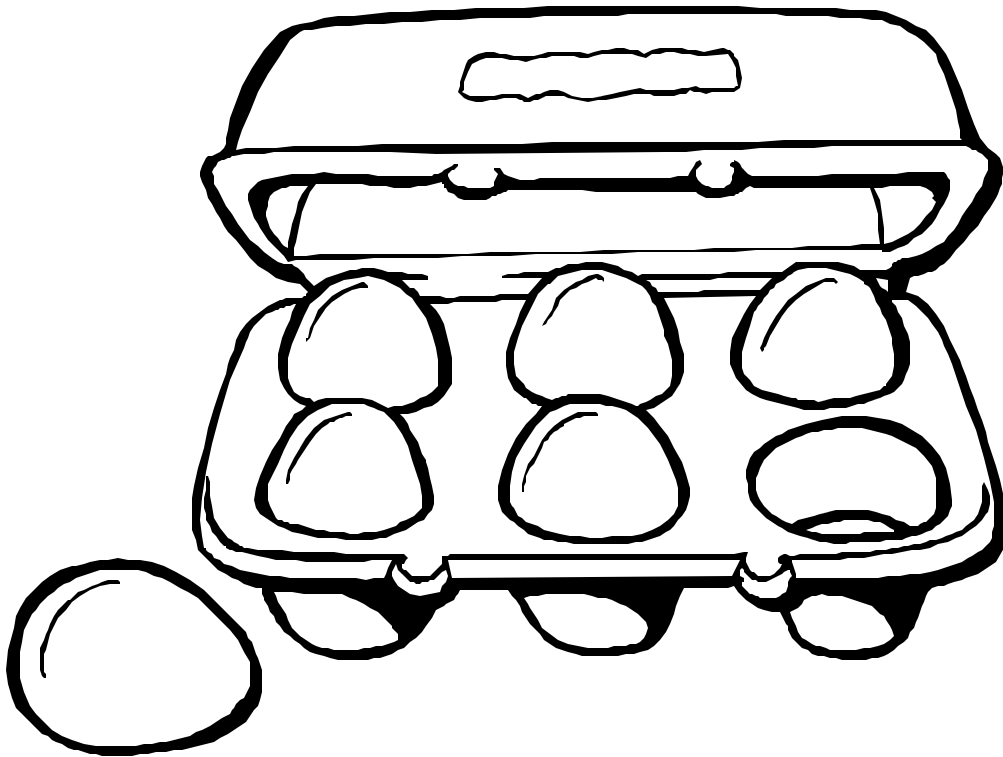


date palm

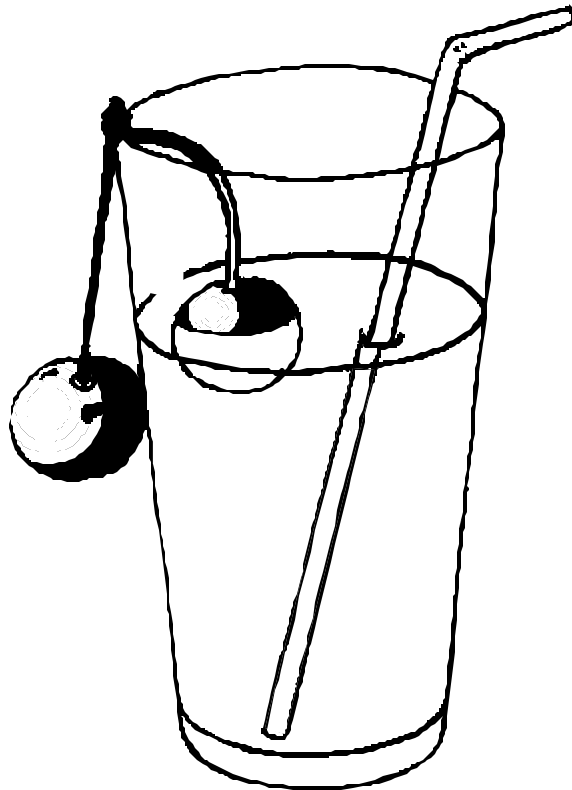


iceberg lettuce

Fun fact: A nectarine is a fuzzless variety of peach.

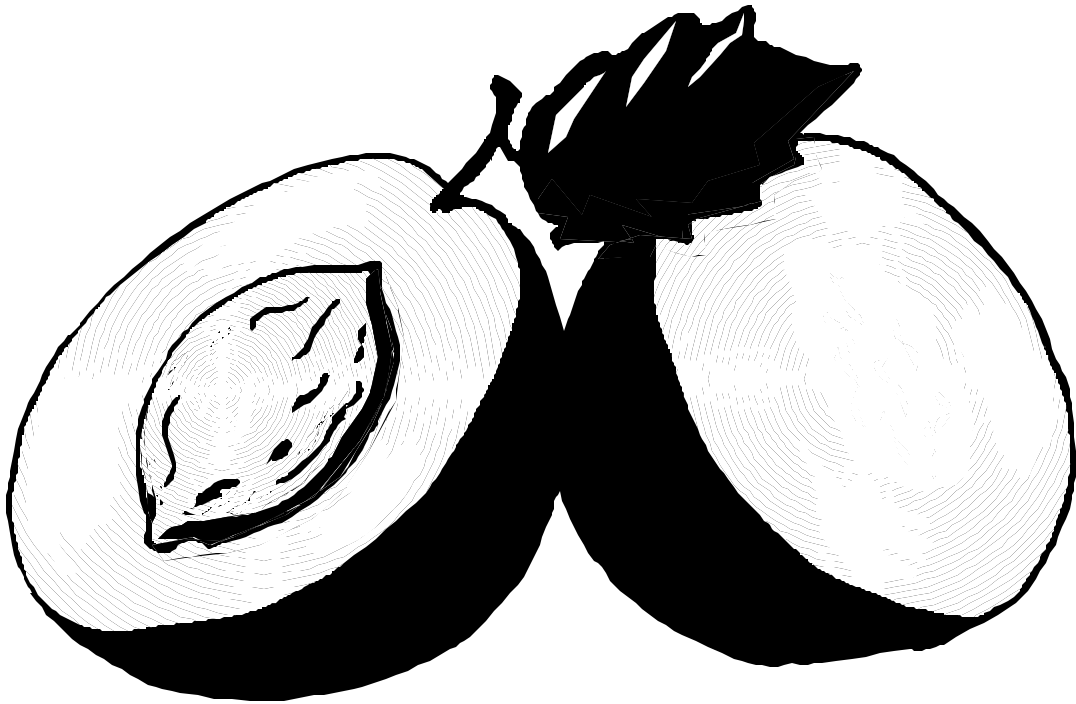

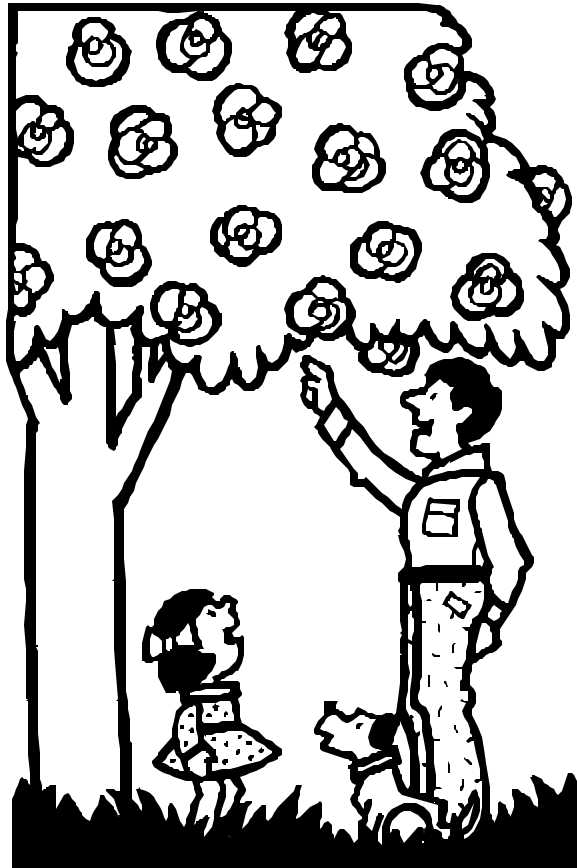


tomatoes

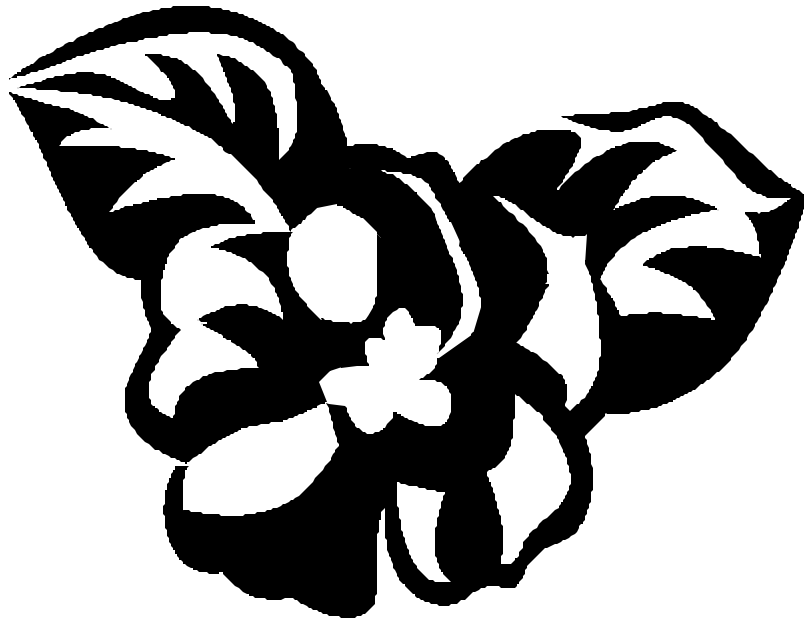
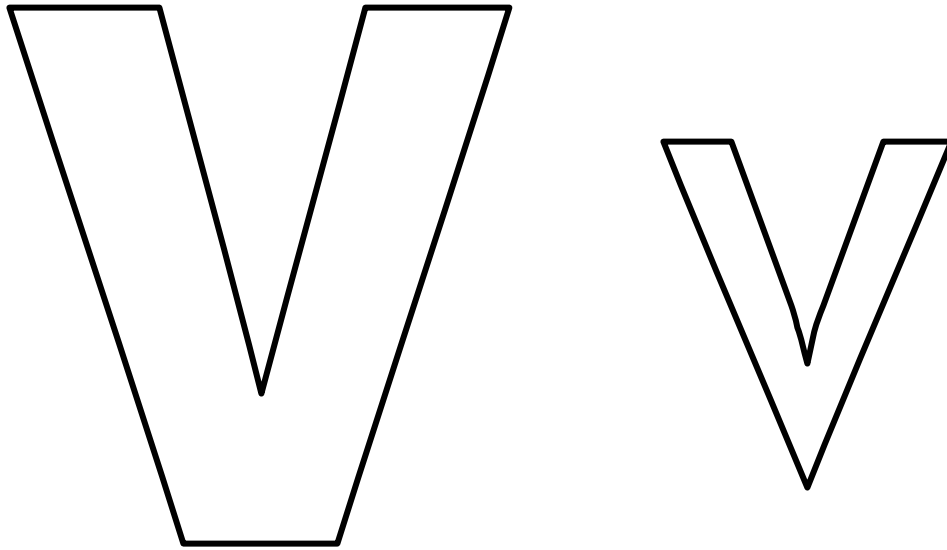

Fun fact: Some farmers run U-Pick farms where you can go and gather your own apples, peaches or other fruit.

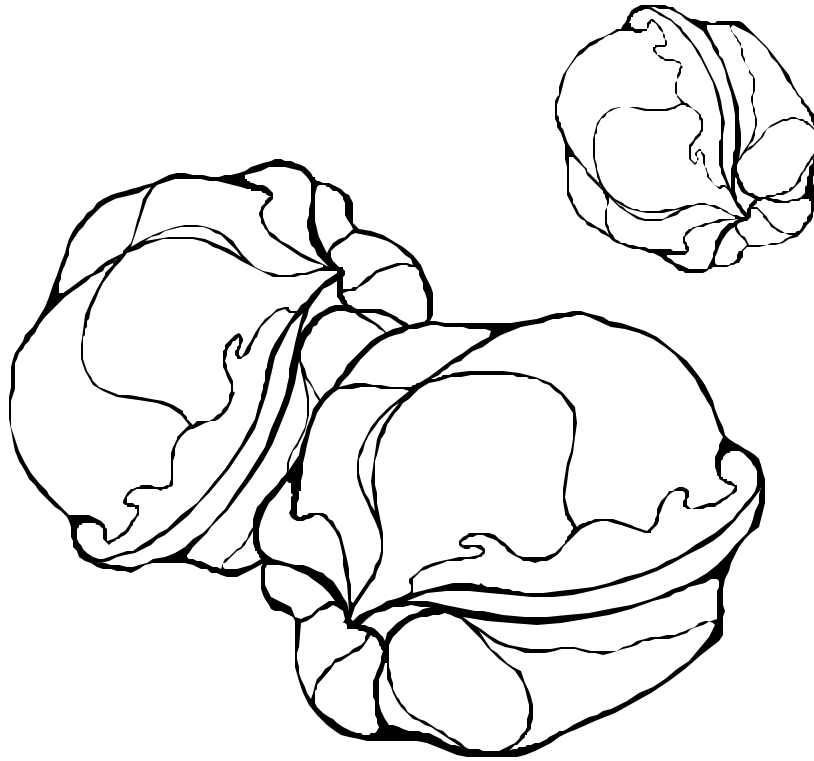
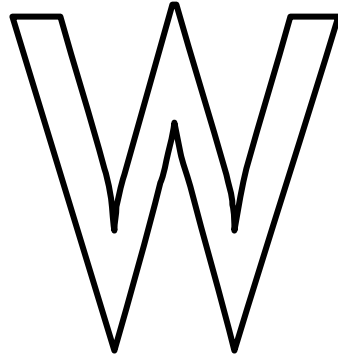

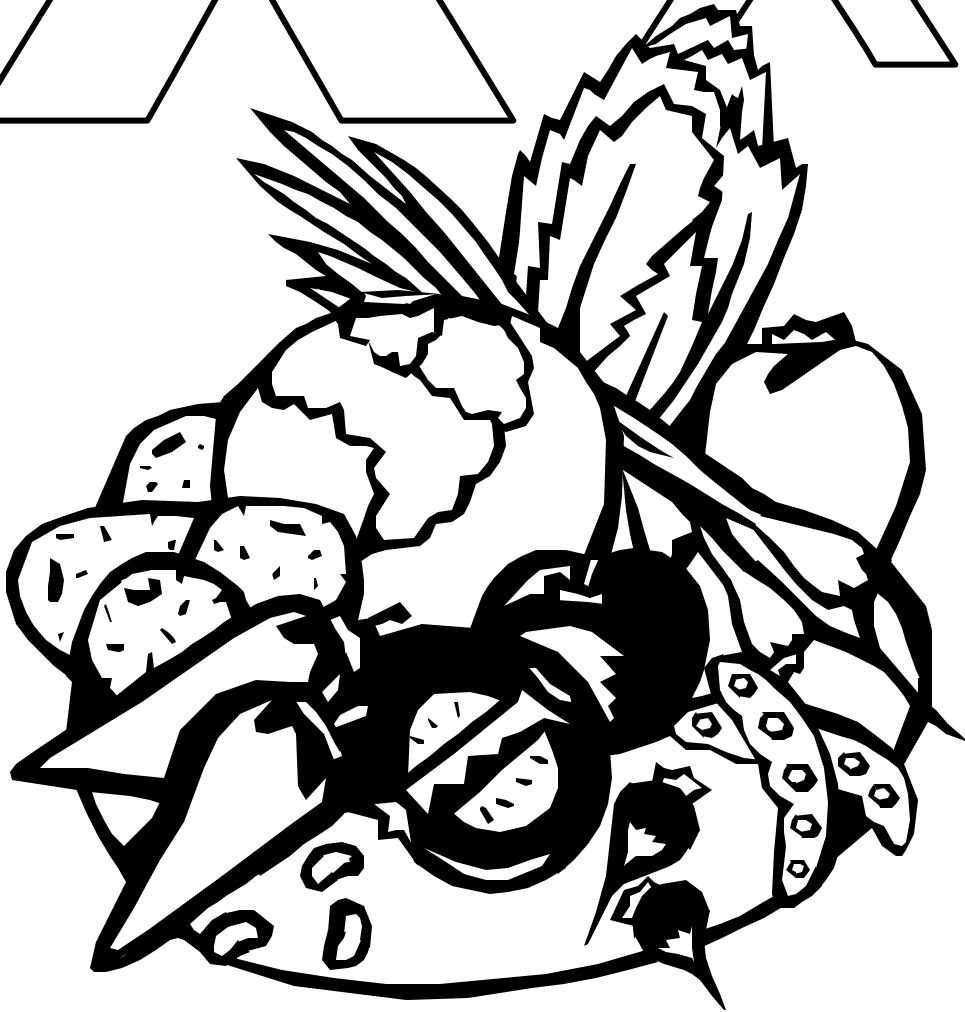


walnut

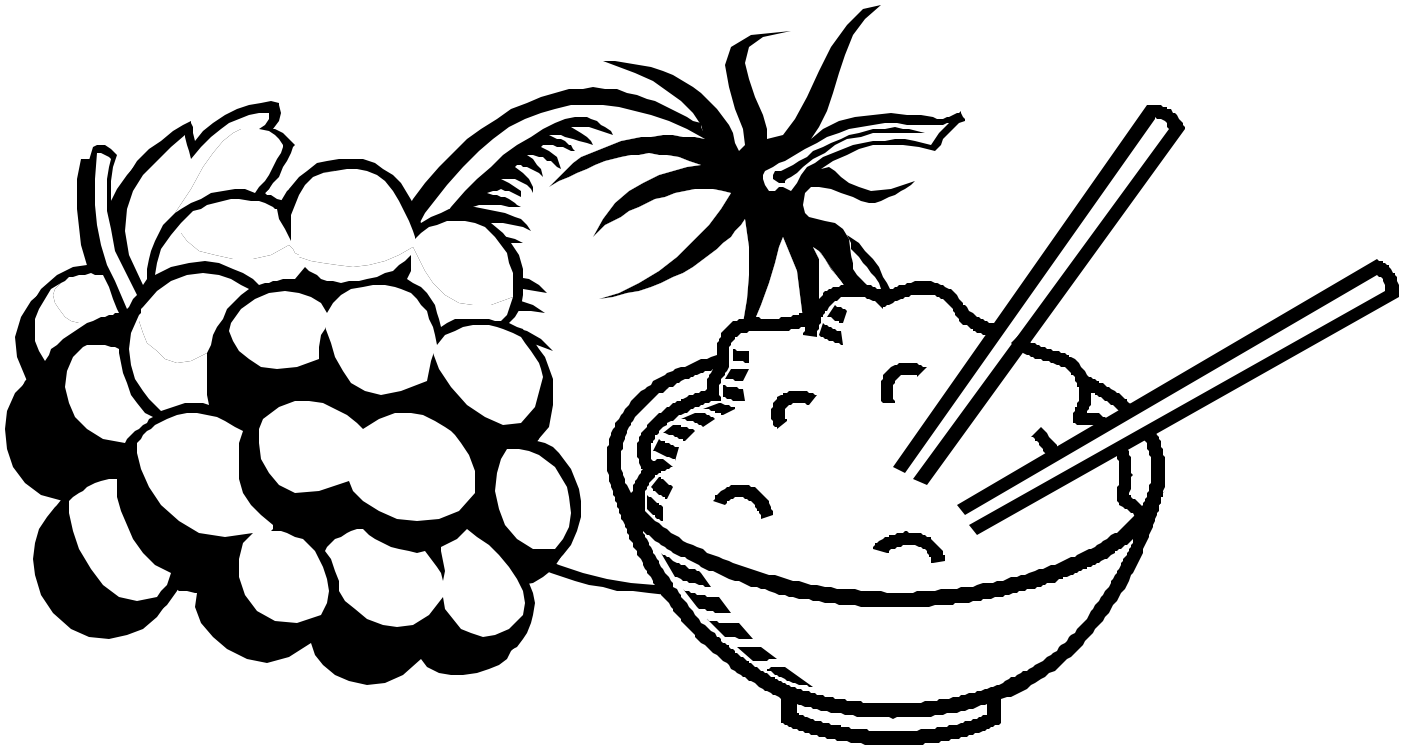

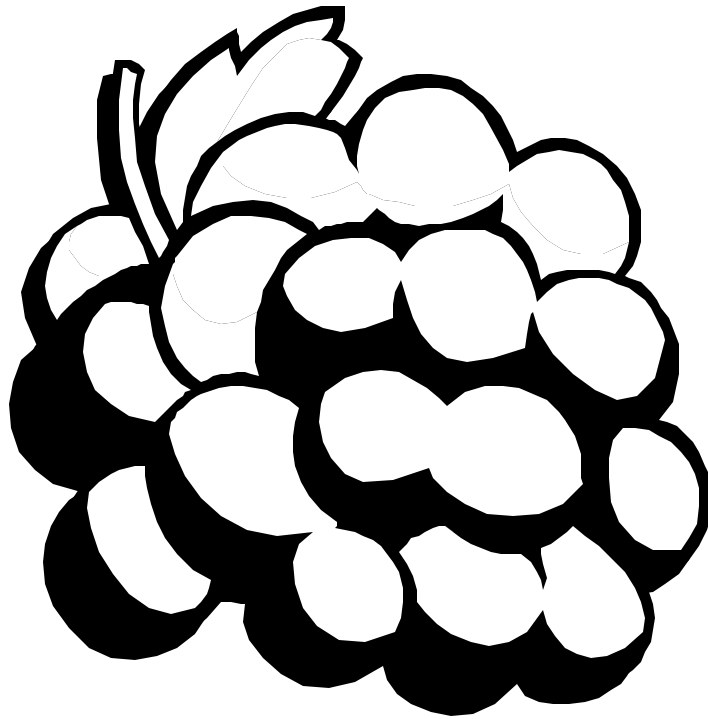
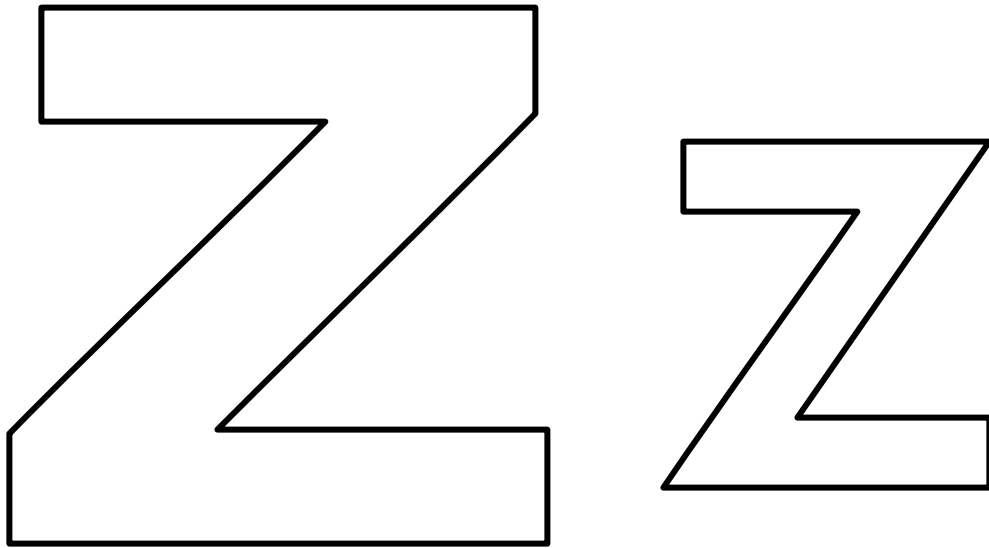

Fun fact: Yolo County, California grows processing tomatoes, grapes, rice, alfalfa hay and seed crops.

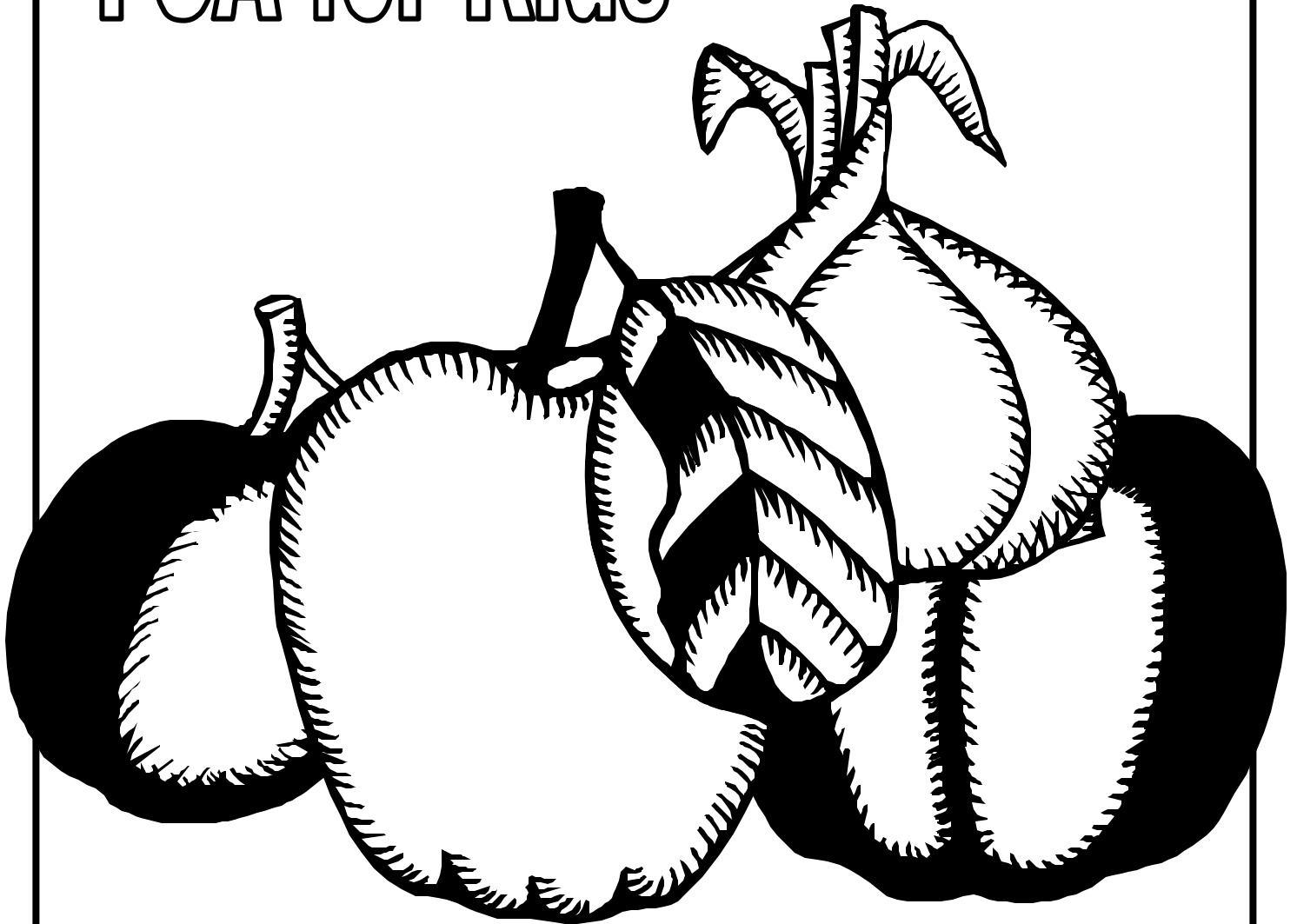
