


More than 80 percent of Massachusetts farms are family-owned. Over 93 percent fit the category of "small farms". Cranberries are the state's most valuable product.




Nebraska may be known as the Cornhusker State, but it's got a lot to cluck about. The state's chickens produced more than 3 billion eggs last year.





















Cattle and calves are the largest generator of farm income in Tennessee. Other top producers are tobacco, hay, cotton, corn, soybeans, wheat, and tomatoes. Tennessee has the largest 4-H Club membership in the nation.







Vermont is the biggest producer of maple syrup in the United States producing about 37% of the nation's total output.



Peanuts grown in Virginia are known as Cadillac peanuts because of their size and flavor. More than 2,800 peanut farmers plant a total of 75,000 acres of peanuts each year. (An acre is about the size of a football field). That's 150 to 250 million pounds!
