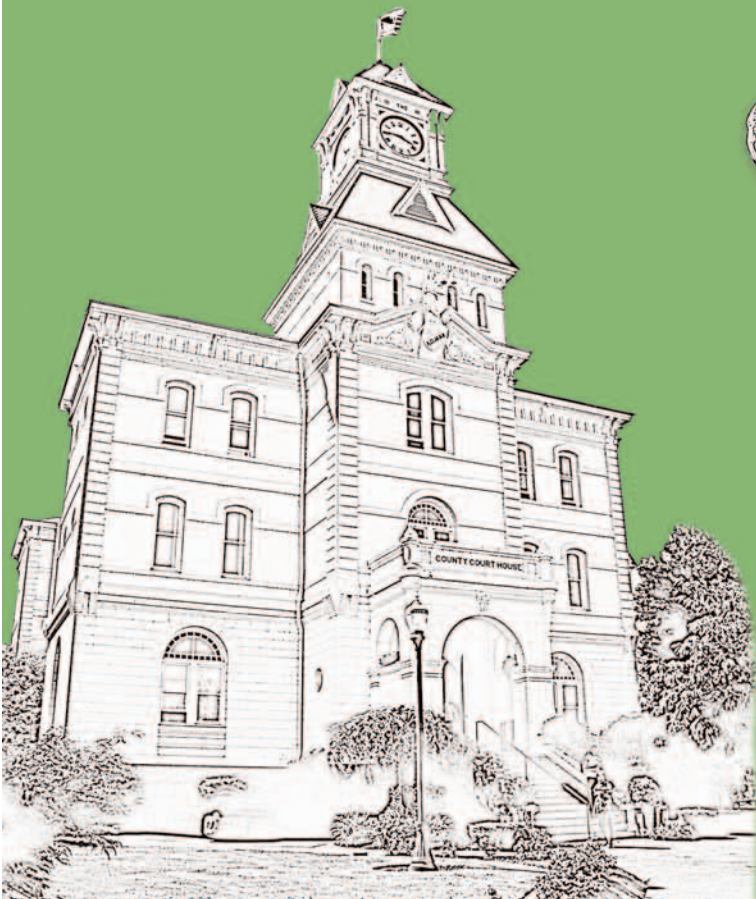

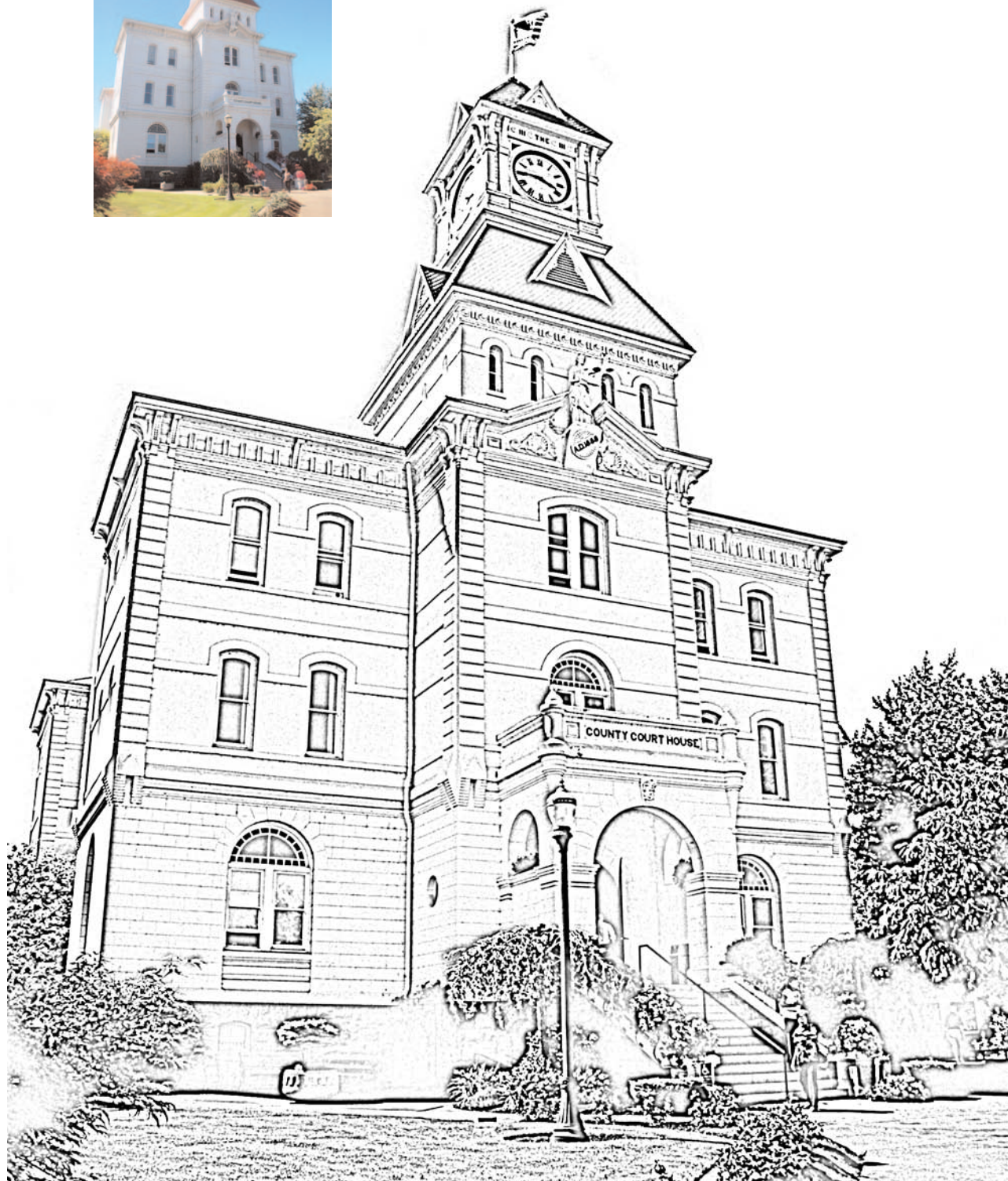


A dinosaur menaces tourists who visit the Prehistoric Gardens on Highway 101 north of Gold Beach.

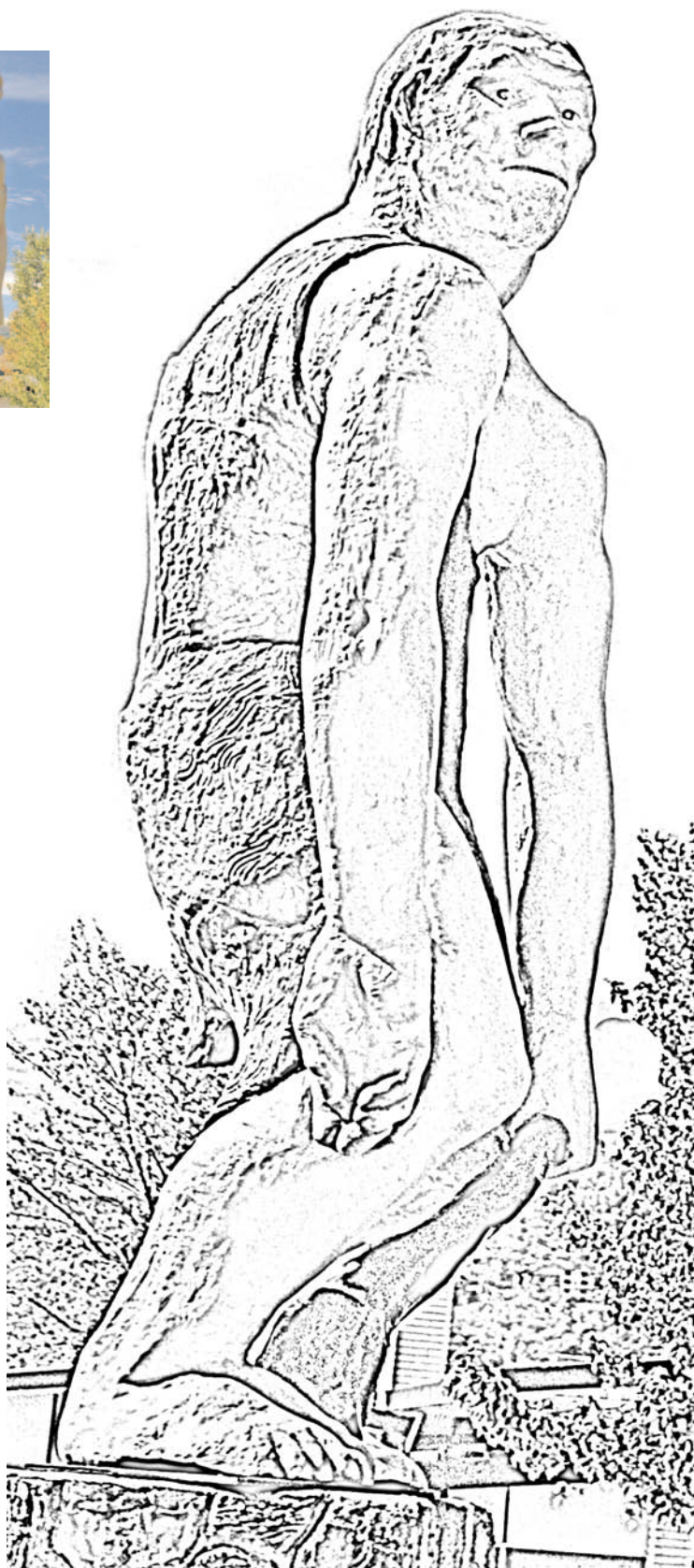
The Western Meadowlark is the official state bird.



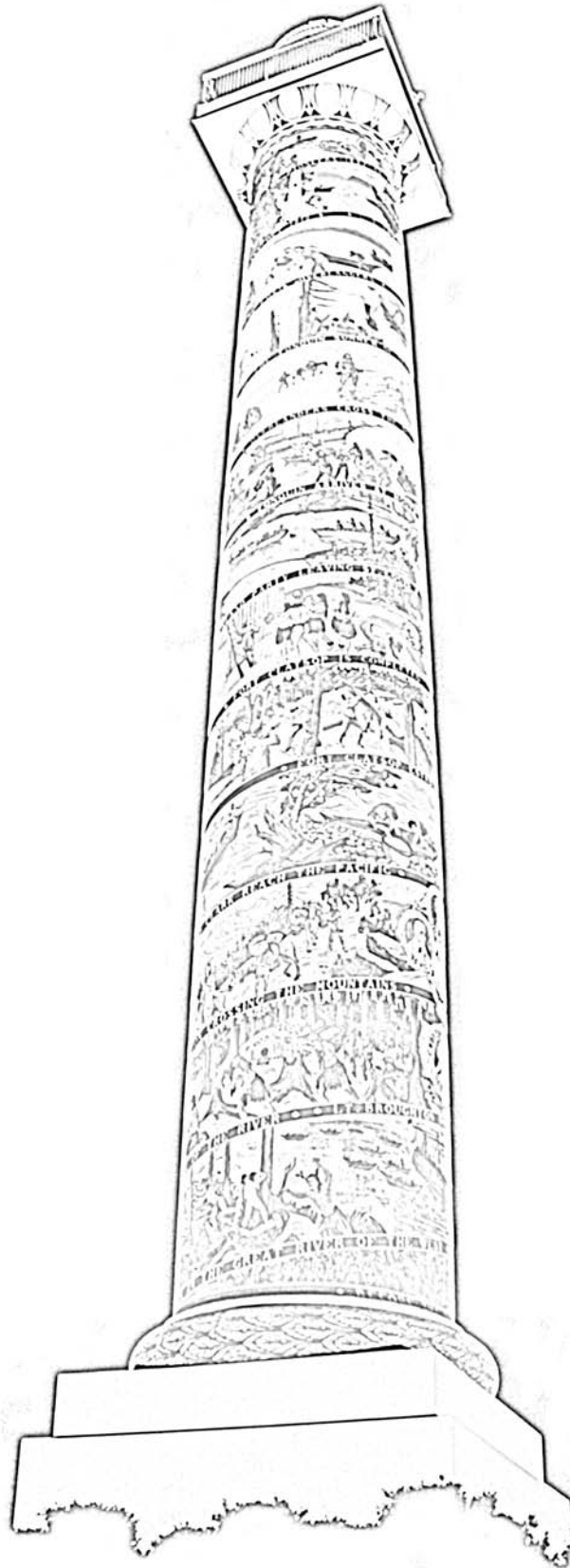
The Benton County Courthouse in Corvallis was built in 1889.



The ornate Noonan House sits on the edge of Jacksonville.



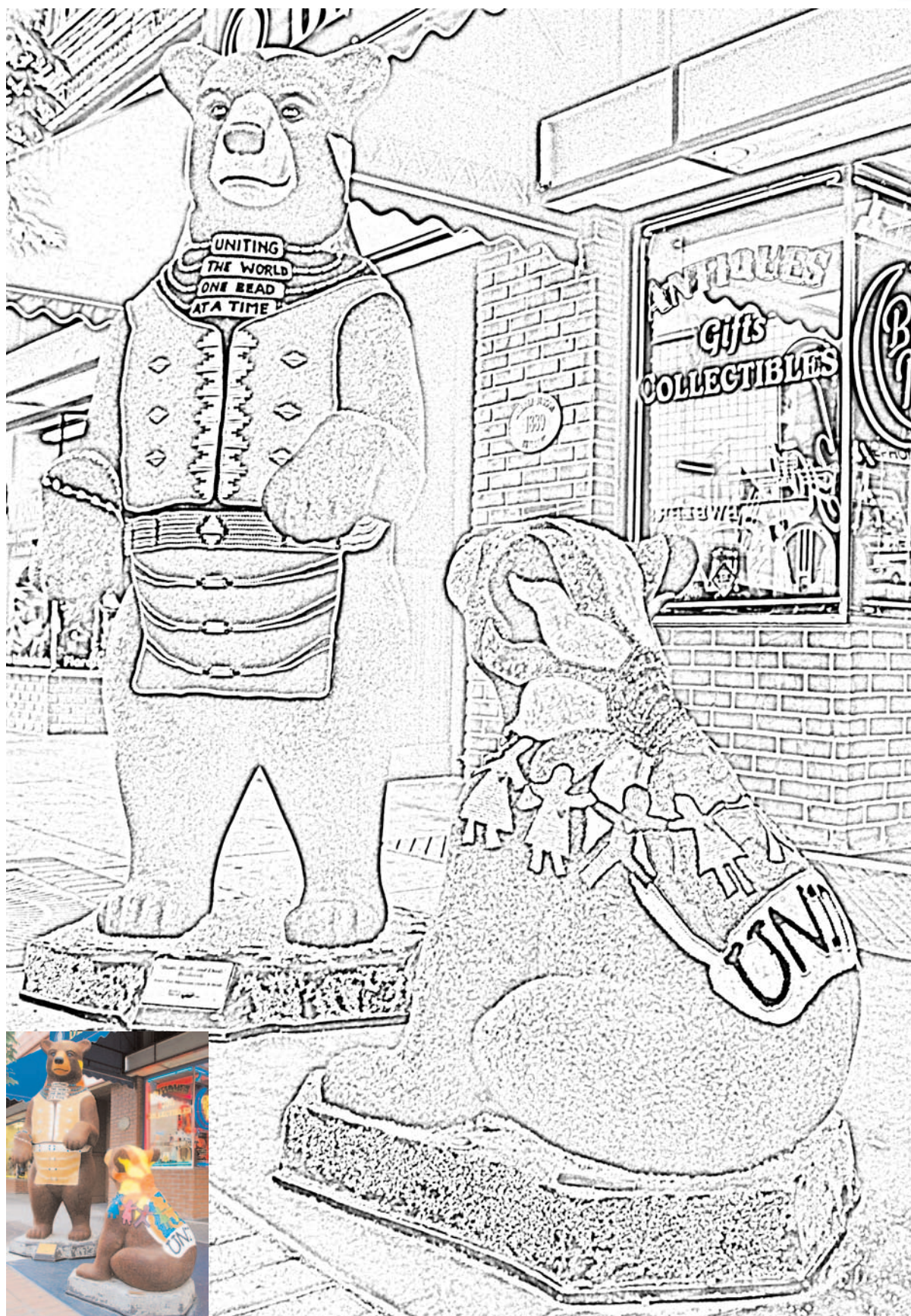
A towering 18-foot-tall fiberglass caveman stands among the trees in Grants Pass.

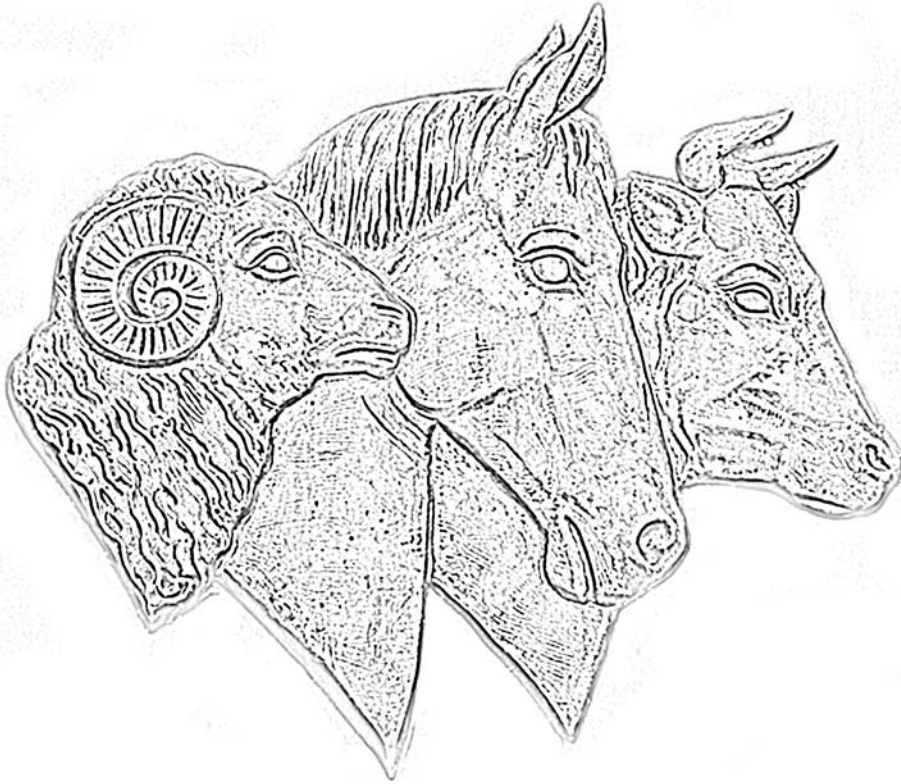

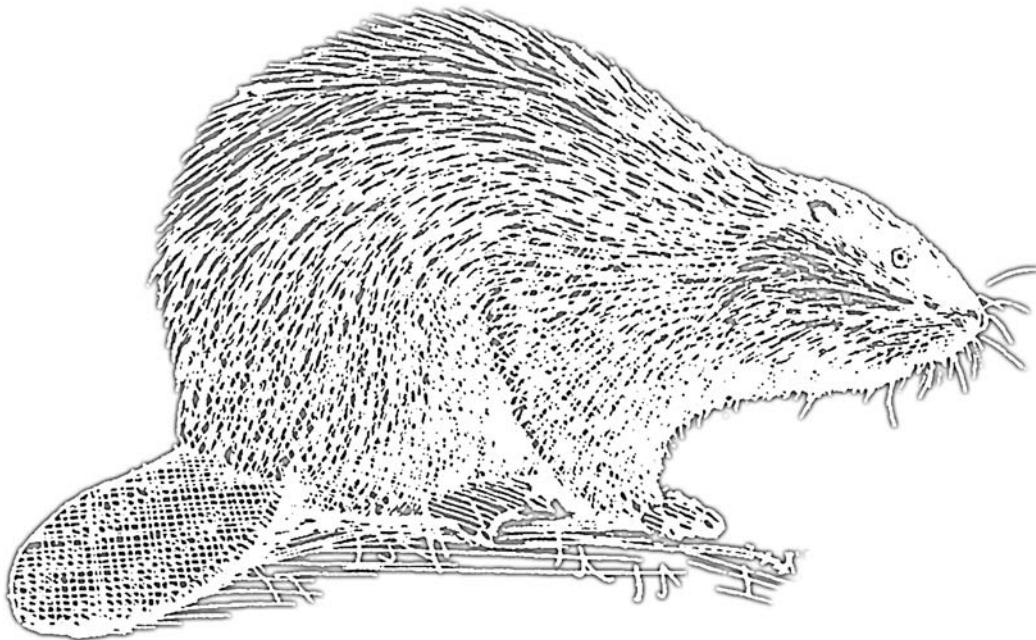

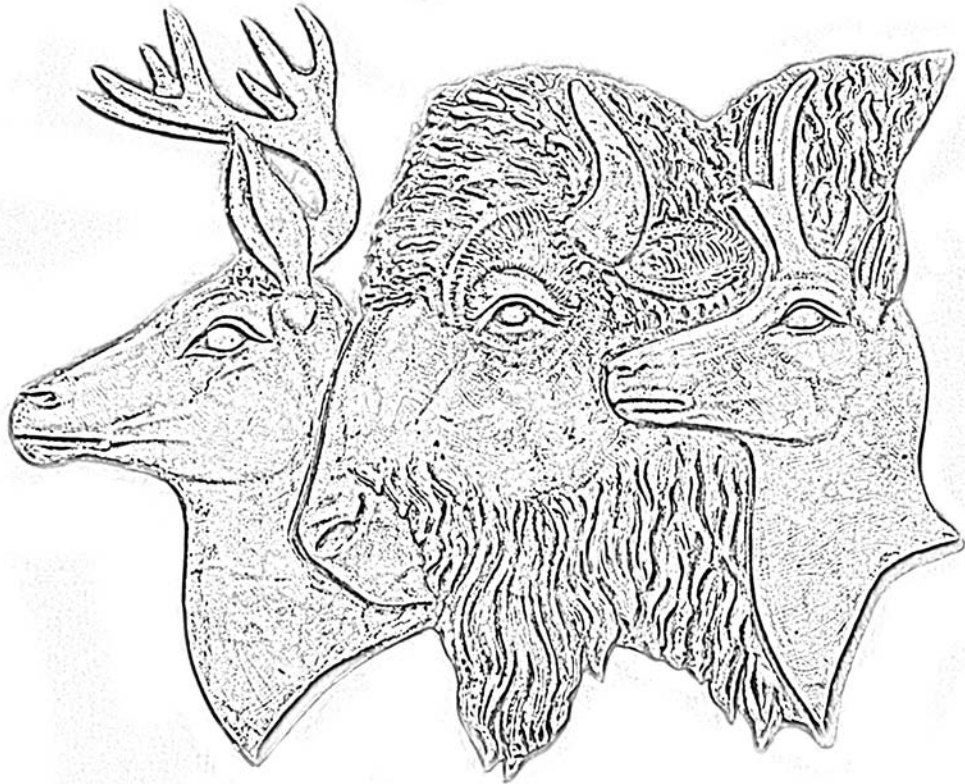

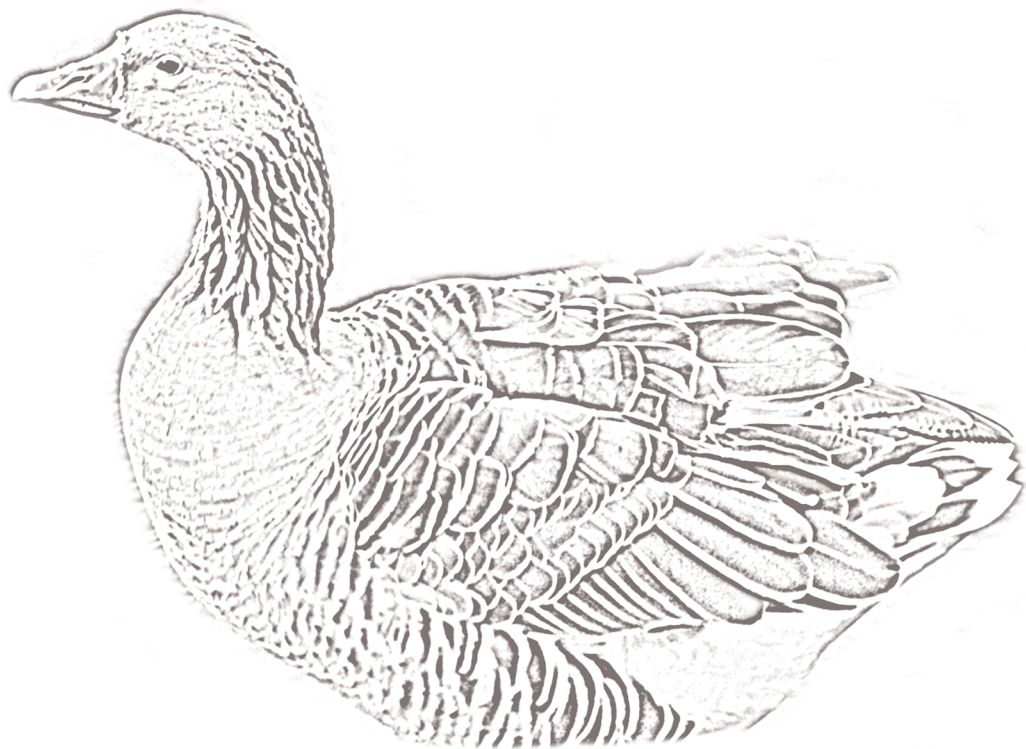

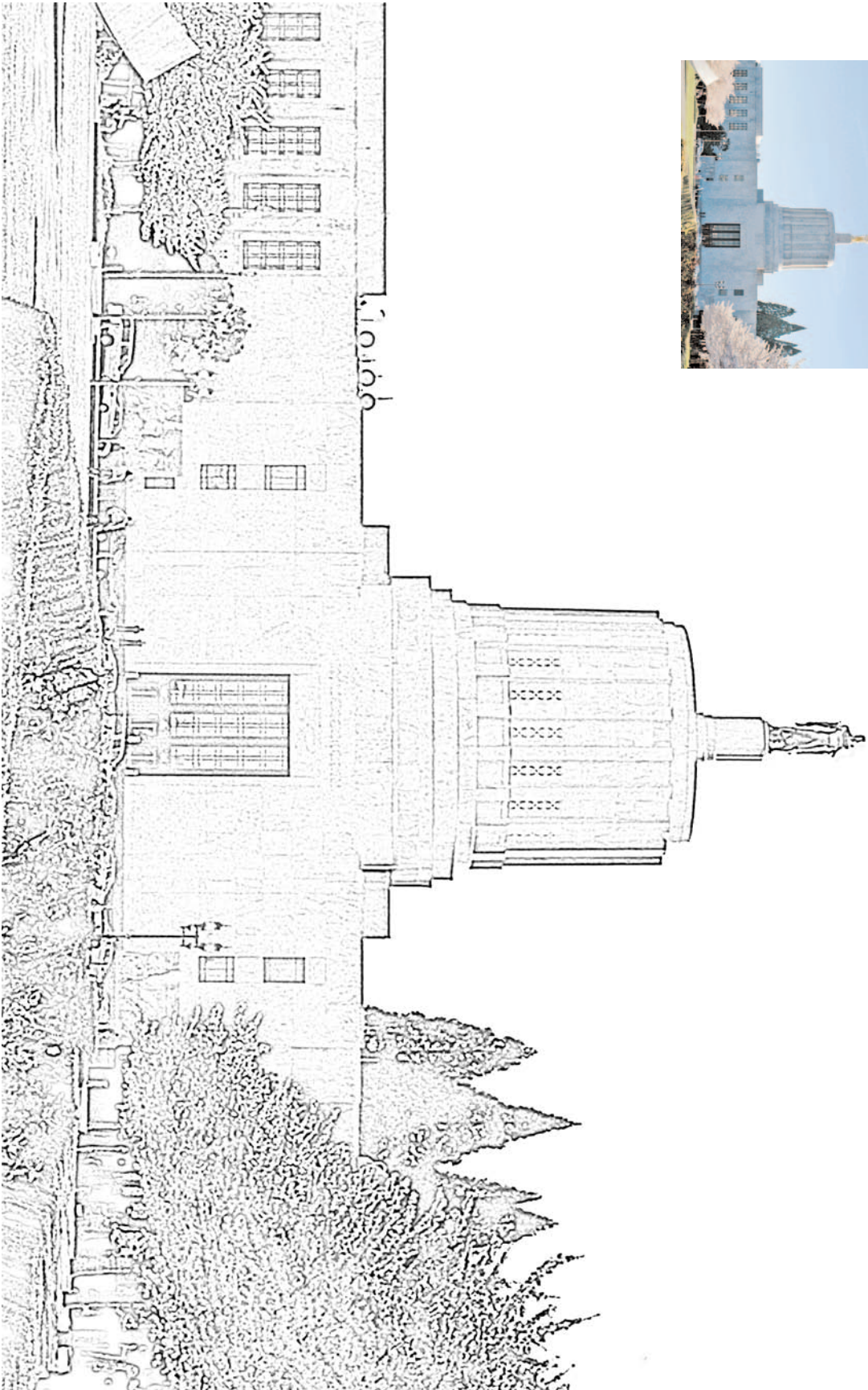

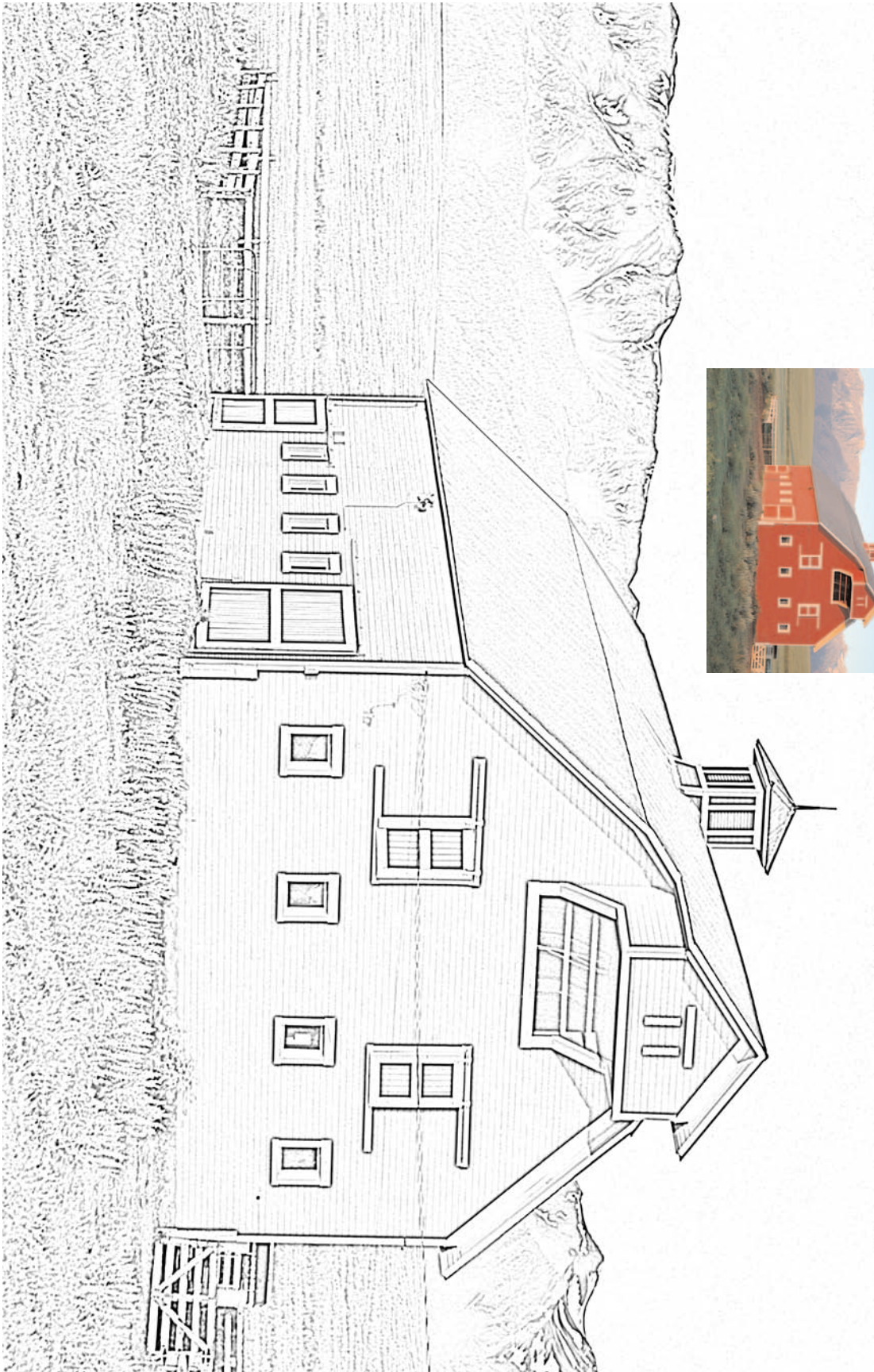

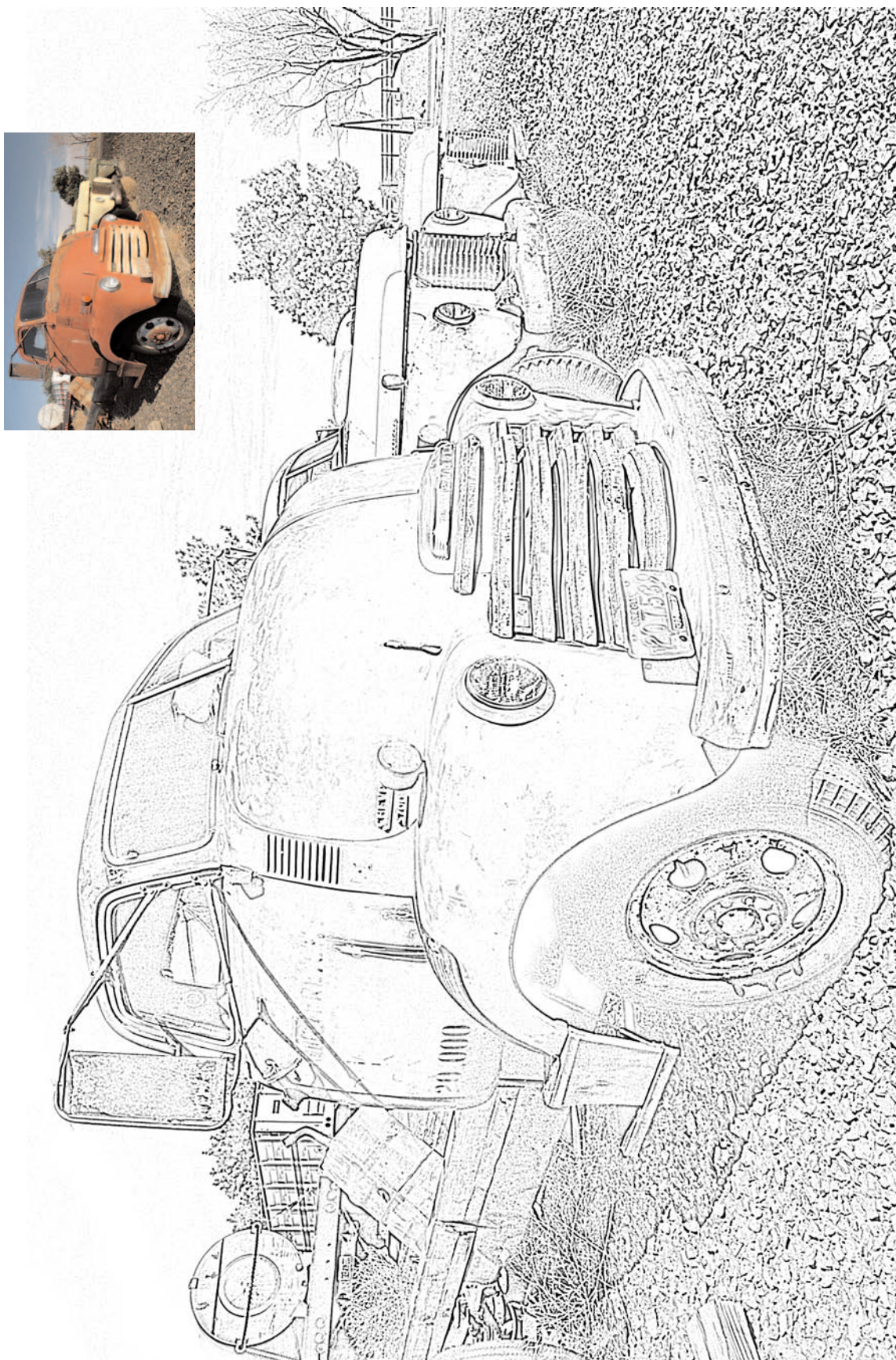
The Oregon State Capitol in Salem was completed in 1936 to replace the previous capitol that fire destroyed in 1935.

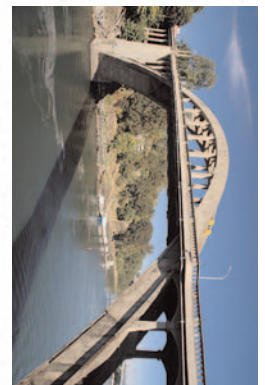

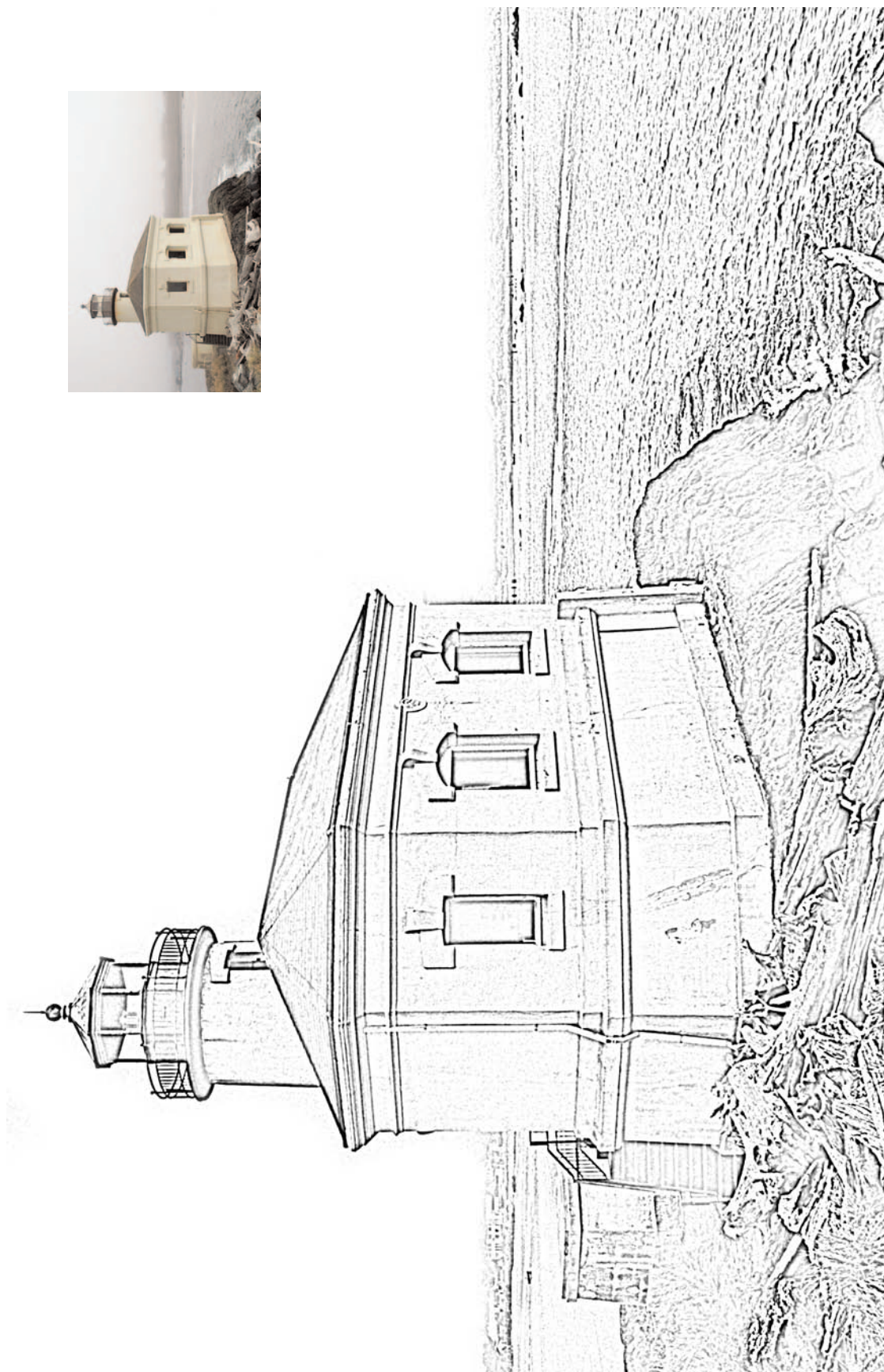

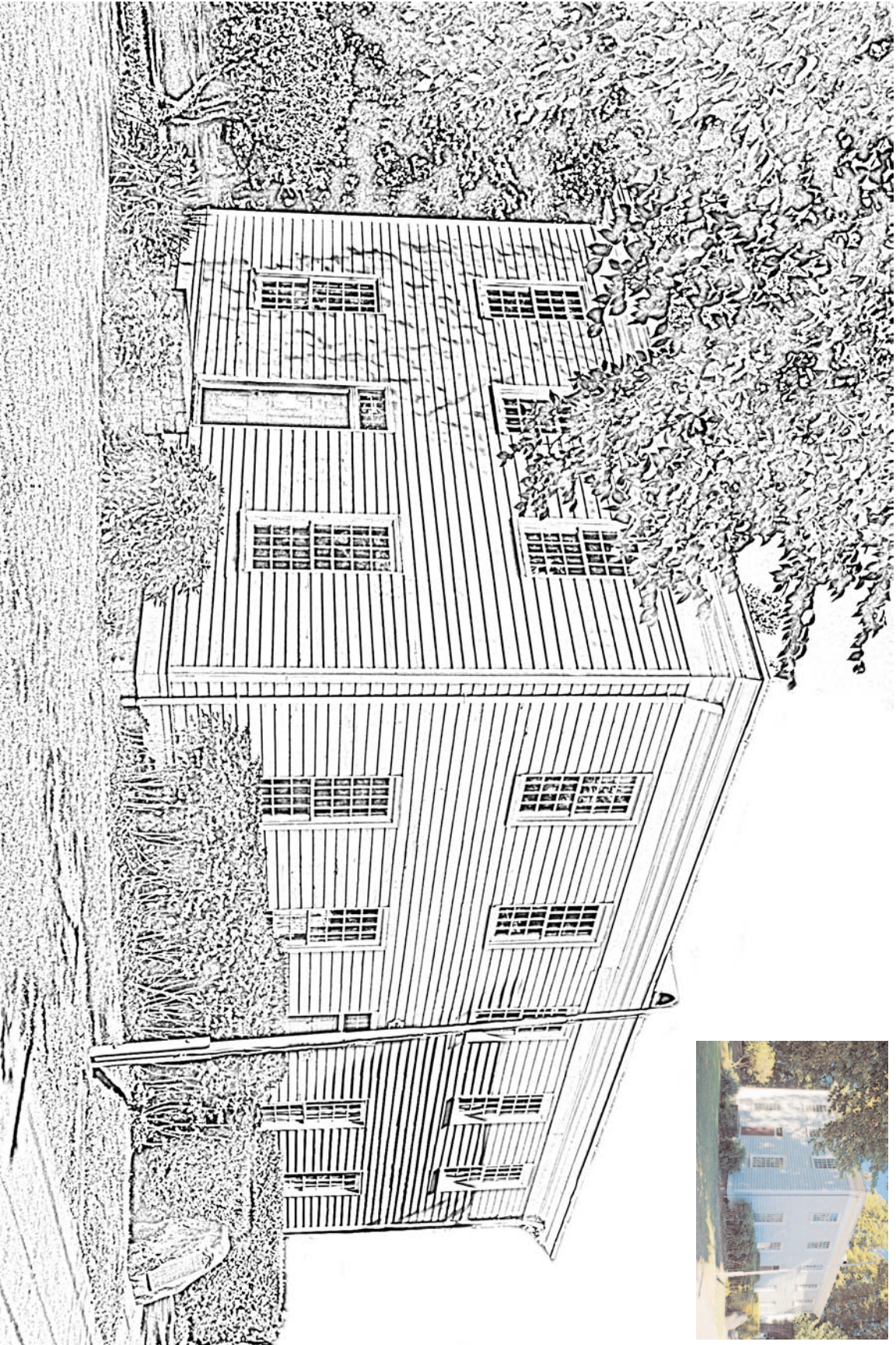


A bridge over the Willamette River at Oregon City.

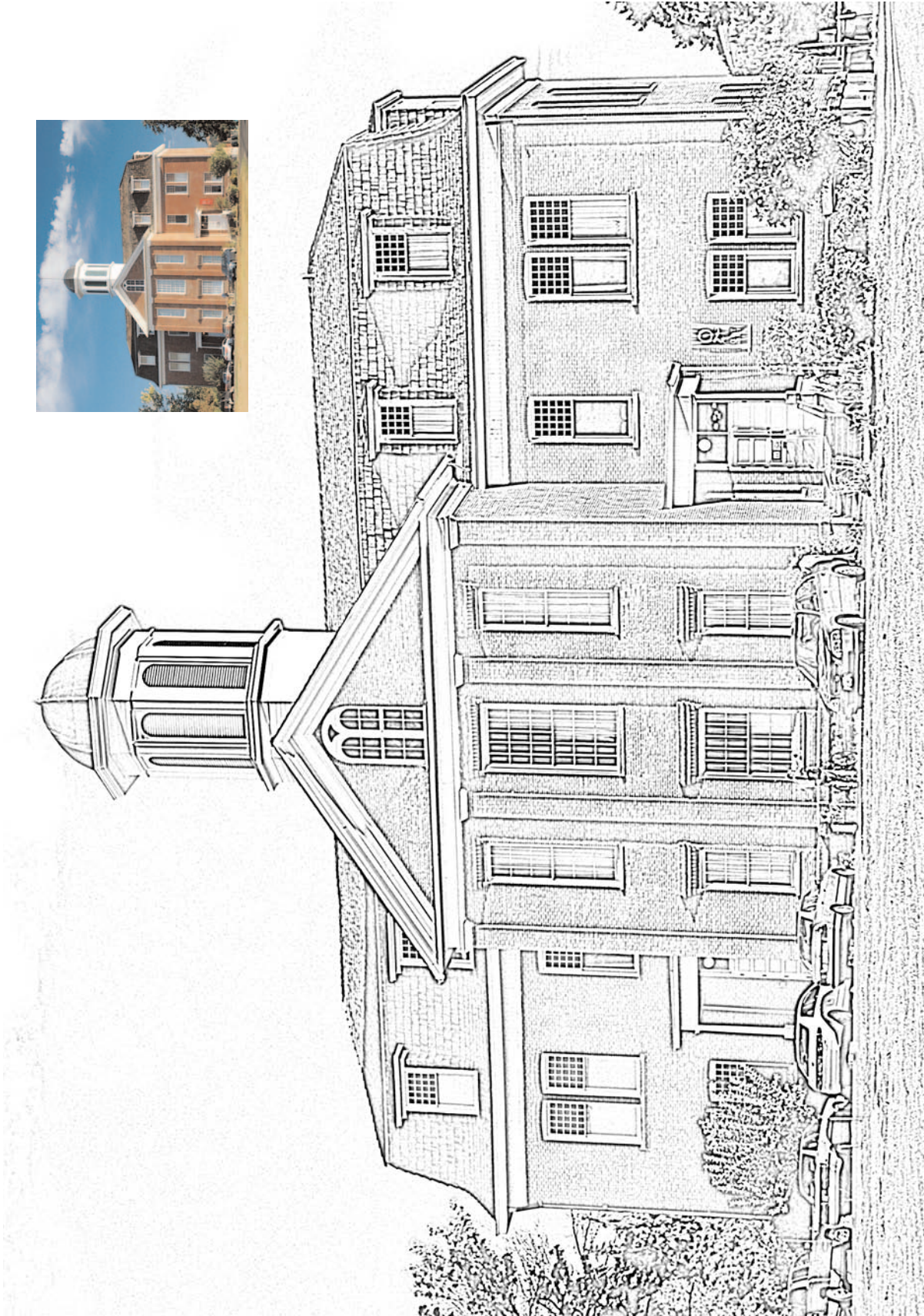

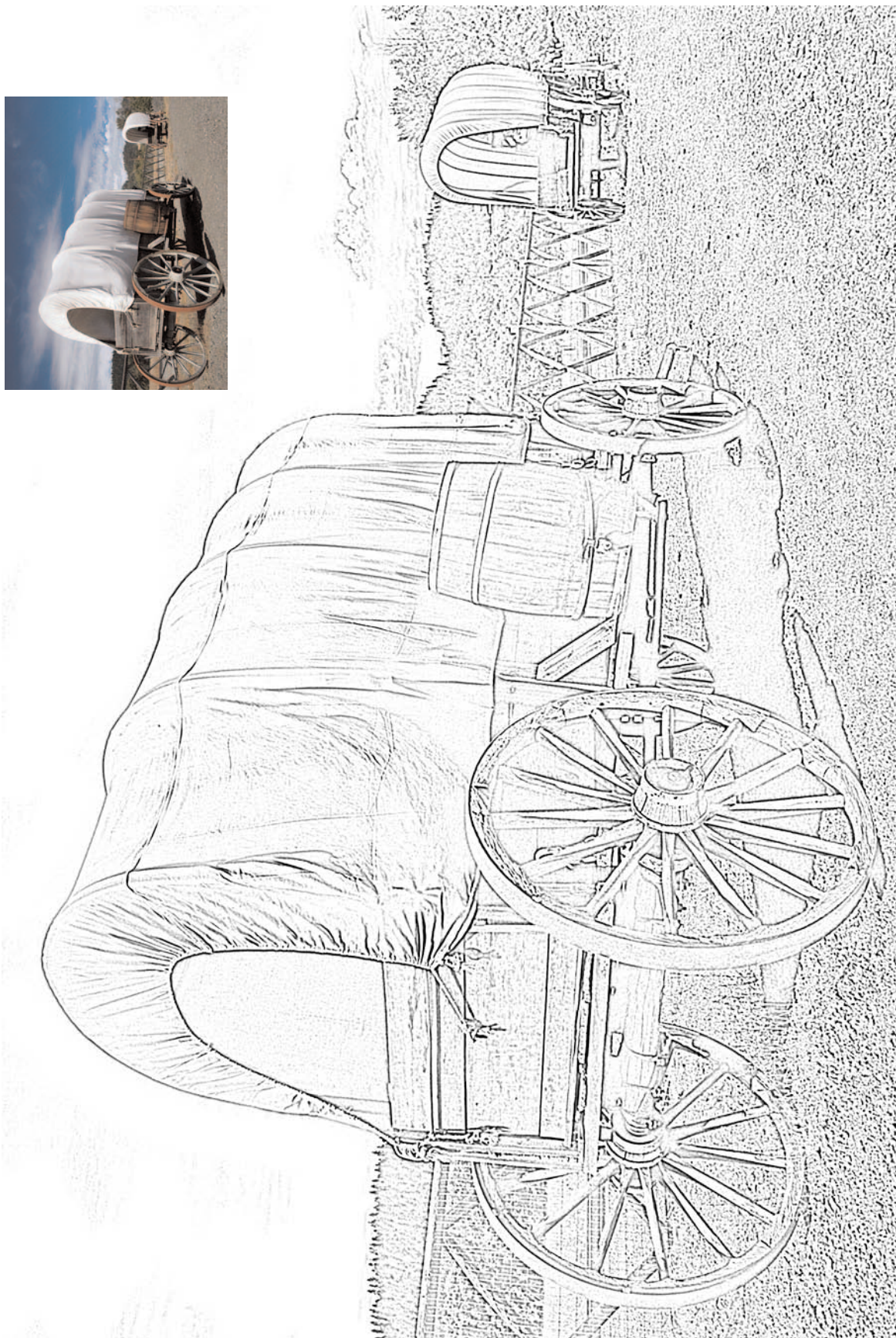
The McLoughlin House in Oregon City. John McLoughlin was named the "father of Oregon" by the Legislature.

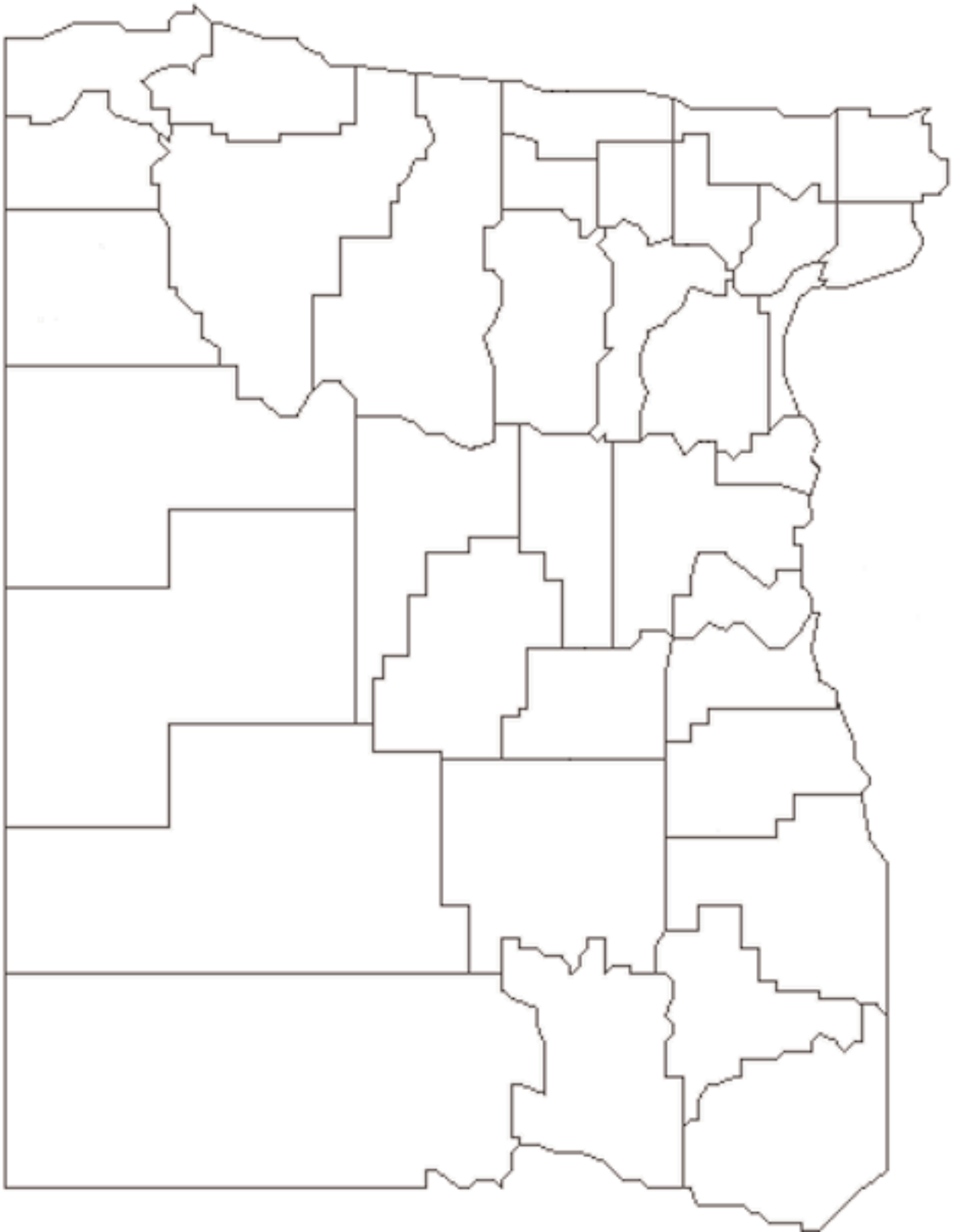

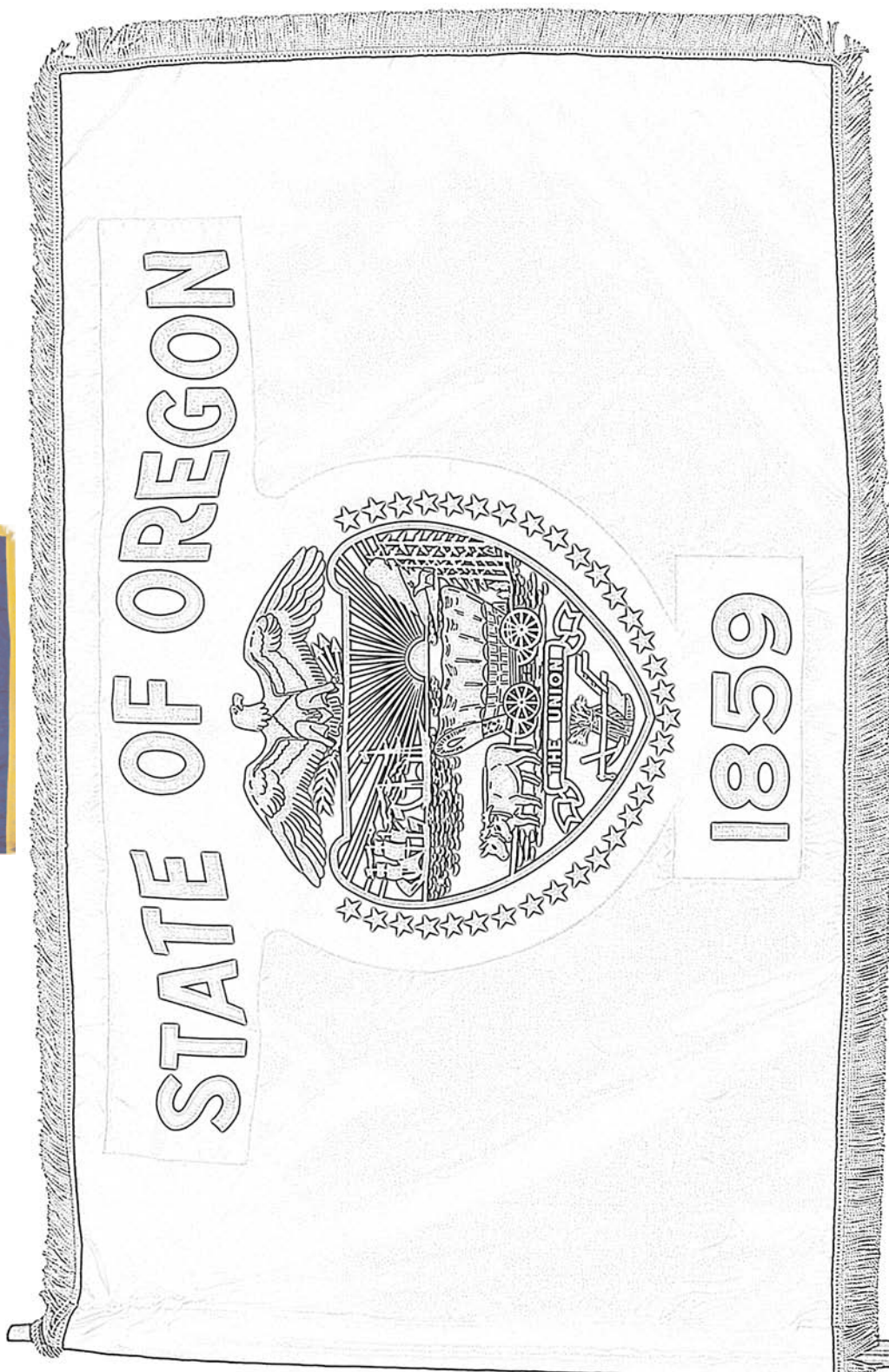
